






Marbled Godwit

Bob has had an innate passion for art and nature since childhood. At a very young age, he began drawing and painting wildlife, primarily birds. His photography background started in his early youth, when a generous friend in the Lynchburg Bird Club lent him a vintage macro camera, which took color slides. While in middle school, he learned to develop black and white film and prints. It was not long before he installed a darkroom in his parent's basement. Bob graduated from E.C. Glass High School in Lynchburg, Virginia, then studied Art and Design at Virginia Tech. For several years after college, he worked as a production artist and designer at Clifton Studios, which hand-reproduced paintings for the furniture decor industry. Several of his designs became best sellers and were sold at national furniture store chains. Within a few years, Bob

was promoted to Production Manager, and eventually became the Art Director. In the mid-90's, he founded a graphic arts business, Infinity Graphics in Bedford County, which moved to Richmond a decade later.

Just after the turn of the century, the evolution of digital camera technologies, enticed a striving in his photography efforts. Images could now be captured in a method, and at a rate, that was not previously possible. In just a few years, Bob's work began to be published in magazines, calendars, bird books, newspapers, and more. Then he began to present nature-based education programs and lectures. Since then, he has spoken to over a hundred different organizations. In the last
